Background:

As part of the ongoing process to lift movement restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, The UK government announced that churches and cathedrals were legally permitted to re-open for public worship from the 4th of July 2020. A second "tiered-structured lockdown" came into effect on the 5th of November 2020 and as a response to rising Covid-19 cases, the Government announced another national lockdown from the 5th of January 2021. Under current guidelines, places of worship are permitted to stay open.

Government guidance for the safe use of places of worship requires that a COVID-19 risk assessment be carried out for every building and site open to the public. In line with government directives, this document summarises results from FOP's risk assessment with links to relevant government advice notes. It covers FOP's risk assessment methodology and the control measures put in place for safe re-opening of FOP church building to members of the public. It also offers guidance on best-practices during acts of worship and administrative church operations.

I ask that you carefully read this risk assessment report and fully adhere to the instructions stated therein.

Rest assured that FOP is closely monitoring the situation and will keep you updated on the latest instructions from the UK government on this matter. For your reference, further information about COVID-19 virus can be found online at www.nhs.uk/coronavirus.

Section I - Risk Assessment Methodology

A four-step process was used in assessing potential risks and developing control measures/ mitigation strategies for identified risks:

- 1. Activity definition list of activities expected in church premises and permitted uses to plan for:
 - Private prayers (ministers, stewards, and church members)
 - Private prayers (general public)
 - Public worship
 - Livestreaming services
 - Weddings, christenings, funerals, and other rites of passage services
 - Services with controlled attendance e.g. church workers-only, ministers-only
 - Counselling sessions
 - Opening for visitors and tourists.
- 2. Hazard assessment:
 - Transmission of COVID-19
 - Hazards arising from the temporary closure of the church
 - Hazards arising from now using the church in a different way

Key constraints and considerations on the movement of people within and outside worship spaces.

Access and utilization of communal spaces e.g. toilet(s).

- 3. Hazard implications and impact assessment:
 - Who might be harmed and how?
 - How will planned activities affect different groups of people? e.g. children and adults aged 65 and over.
- 4. Control measures and mitigation strategies:
 - mitigations for identified risks, e.g. temperature-checking devices, hand sanitizers, face masks
 - pre-requisites and actions required for planned activities to go ahead safely e.g. COVID-deep cleaning
 - required equipment and changes needed to previous mode of operations e.g. modified seating arrangements and service times.
